TOP 5 DELIVERY PRIORITIES - 2025

- Connect further with diverse communities by offering alternative and free to access routes into the sport e.g. Crick-lish, work with established charitable organisations outside of sport, Friends of the Caribbean in Milton Keynes
- 2. Lead a culture of inclusion in the game, including all Bucks Cricket staff to undertake ongoing EDI training
- 3. Build a network of female coaches and officials in the county to support and grow the female game
- 4. Produce 5 case studies from all target areas to understand the impact the sport has had on people's health, mental well-being, confidence etc.
- 5. Create the 3rd MCCF centre for State School non-County Pathway cricketers and ensure equivalent programme for Bucks Cricket Women as for Bucks Cricket Men

BACKGROUND

Buckinghamshire's population is 840,138 (2021 census).

The county has 2 councils:

- Milton Keynes
- Buckinghamshire

Population split: Milton Keynes – 34%, Buckinghamshire 66% Ethnic diversity split: Milton Keynes 28%, Buckinghamshire 21%

BUCKS CRICKET CIO - 2025

Employed Staff: 15 total – 26% female, 13% ethnically diverse Contract Coaches: 29 total – 31% female, 41% ethnically diverse Board Trustees: 9 total – 44% female, 11% ethnically diverse

Community Programmes

- 9 Street Cricket hubs:
 677 participants, 193 (29%) girls, 608 (90%) ethnically diverse
- 4 Disability Cricket hubs: 52 participants, 4 (8%) female, 23 (44%) ethnically diverse
- 18 Urban All Stars/Dynamos centres (2024): 379 participants, 117 (31%) girls

Club Cricket

- 98 affiliated Clubs
- 56 Junior sections:



- o 338 Junior teams 24% ethnically diverse (2023)
- All Stars/Dynamos centres:
 - o 2070 participants 29% ethnically diverse

County Pathway

- Early Engagement Phase (Regions)
 - o Girls U10-12: 49 players, 44% ethnically diverse, 59% attend State Schools
 - o Boys U11-13: 160 players, 51% ethnically diverse, 65% attend State Schools
- County Age Groups
 - o Girls U13-18: 62 players, 39% ethnically diverse, 74% attend State Schools
 - o Boys U13-18: 85 players, 61% ethnically diverse, 77% attend State Schools
- MCC Foundations Hubs (all attend State Schools)
 - o Girls U14-16: 47 players, 49% ethnically diverse
 - o Boys U14-16: 53 players, 64% ethnically diverse

In 2024, Bucks Youth Cricket provided bursaries to County Pathway cricketers for training and match programmes totalling £8,200.

MILTON KEYNES

MK population: 287,060 - 28% ethnically diverse. MK Council is planning for a population of 410,000 in the City by 2050. MK lacks a vibrant junior cricket competition programme with many clubs/teams struggling for quality facilities and volunteer organisation. We commenced a 3-year MK Cricket City plan in 2024 and have been building positive relationships with a wide ranging diverse community groups, Clubs and Teams.
